BART ROBERTS - \$90 - Patrick Stamile 2008 -27" TET EEEv 6.5" RE - very large orchid rose with a huge velvety blue red eye. Both clarity and vibrancy of color is fantastic. Siblings to BART ROBERTS also had prominent white sharks teeth outside the red border so it is expected that BART ROBERTS may be useful in structural edges as well as borders. Fertile both ways.



BATMAN'S SHADOW - \$100 - Petit, T. 2007 -29" Sev. 7 I love the shadowy irregular patterned watermark in this flower which always reminds me of Batmans image beaming up against the night sky. The very large clear purple flowers have a heavy substance and open flat. At the center of the flower is a green throat. The wide petalled flowers are nicely ruffled, carrying a gold edge. Unique and different.



BEFORE - \$80 - Murphy 2011 -16 EE 6 Dormant diploid Unusual Form Cascade -This plant starts blooming before all daylilies except three in our garden, and is in full bloom when Stella starts. It is a pink and cream bitone cascade with green throat. Note, this is a large flower, not your more typical small extra early. It is nocturnal, opening at midnight and closing around 7pm the next day. Gorgeous blue green foliage, 3 branches, 18 buds. Pollen fertile. Out of PINK RAIN DANCE by unknown. Donated by Jim Murphy.



BELA ISABELLA - \$125 - Petit, T. 2009 - 28" Sev. 5.5" These ivory flowers have a very dramatic chevron applique that extends far out onto the petal self. Outside the applique is a lavender violet patterned eye. The eye is surrounded by a dark purple mascara band that streaks inward. The pattern eye is mimicked on the sepals and continues as a double purple and violet picotee around the petal edges. The picotee edge is surrounded by a third bubbly gold wire edge. Striking and dramatic.



BELLERIEVE KISS-A-ME - \$25 - McClarren, T 2000 - 26" DIP Dor Mid 6" - Pink cream with rose eye and ruffled edge. Donated by Roma Radford.



BOLERO EYES - \$75 - Carpenter - SPRING 2008 - TET 33-EMRe-6.5-EV - Stately large flat-faced flowers of excellent substance. Pink flowers which have bold eyes and edges of a magenta color, with a lovely green throat. Three-way branched scapes bear 17 buds. The cultivar is fertile both ways.



CAPTIVA ISLAND - \$75 - Petit - SPRING 2009 - 24" Mid TETSev. 6 - Like the beautiful golden sunsets of Captiva Island, this flower is a bright beacon in the garden. The flower color is a glowing coral gold, with hints of pink and orange. The petal edges are very ruffled and crimped with a sparkling gold filagree. The gold edges continue around the petaloids as well. The gold, glittering edges all over the flower, combined with the very bright flower color, produces a glittering image of a molten sunset.



CHERRY SWIZZLER - \$125 - Stamile, P.2009 - 42 TET EE 12" Re -16 wingspan. 5-way branching (3 laterals plus terminal y). 35 buds. Classic spider. Spider ratio 6.1:1. This is one of our earliest flowers to bloom. When CHERRY SWIZZLER begins blooming there is literally a sea of green as a backdrop. Blooms are out-facing on tall well branched scapes. Both petals and sepals twist and curl as they cascade down. A lovely addition to the EE class. Fertile both ways but a difficult pod parent.



COLORFUL ETCHINGS - \$150 - Carpenter, J.2009 23 Mid EV 5RE The heritage of this cultivar is easily identified by the patterned eye with its etchings on both petals and sepals. TEXAS KALEIDOSCOPE is very powerful for passing that trait to its seedlings. COLORFUL ETCHINGS has a buff yellow-cream base color with beautifully etched eyes that appear on both the petals and sepals. The eye color is a blend of both lavender and wine color with a deeper wine color etching around petals and sepals. The deeper etched edge of the eye on the petals is accented with deeper fine lines of wine color that radiate downward into the beautiful green throat.

COLORFUL ETCHINGS has a deeper wine edging with some additional lavender edging with it that extends about half way out on the petals. Repeating scapes have two-way branching with fifteen buds. Pollen fertile and pod difficult.



CORONATION DREAM - \$150 - Petit2009 -27" Mid Sev. 6.5 - 7"
DOUBLE -Coronation Dream is by far an extremely sophisticated and commanding DOUBLE flower. The blooms are a soft baby ribbon pink, with both the petals and sepals surrounded by a pronounced gold edge. The flowers are extremely large, especially for a double flower. Both consistently and fully double, and are on tall, very sturdy scapes, a very powerful display of massive pom-pom blooms.



COSENZA - \$50 - Stamile 2008 -28" TETEMidEv. 6 RE -a beautifully formed bright rose pink with a large watermark and gold edge. Bright clear color on tall well branched scapes, color that is so bright and so clear that it radiates across the garden. Fertile both ways and a great parent for both white edges and gold edges.



COSMIC KALIEDOSCOPE - \$150 - Carpenter J.2008 -27 DIP Mid 6.5-Ev RE- flat-faced, lavender self with a wonderful stenciled eye above green throat, but there's much more to it than that simple little description. Take a look at the pictures. The flower is consistently good, and very fertile both ways.



DANCING RAINBOW - \$30 - Smith. F2006 - 28" TET SEv 5.5"DANCING RAINBOW is a beautiful combination of mauve and pink with a delightful bluish-patterned eye and matching edge. Fertile both ways. Donated by Carol Sarginger.



DESERT ICICLE - \$20 - Roberts, N. 1995 - 38" EM SEv DIP8" RE - Greenish pink diamond dusted UF; crisped/spatulate. Donated by Carol Sarginger.



DOWAGER EMPRESS - \$40 - Kirchoff 2004 - 28" Mid Tet EV 5.5" RE
- Blend of carrot, peach, rose rouge, with yellow to green throat. DOUBLE.

ELEGANT HARMONY - \$75 - Carpenter, J.2008 -24 TET EMid EV 5
RE such a beautiful blending or combination of colors. The sepals are of a
lighter coral pink and the petals have a moderately deeper coral pink color
and are extravagantly edged with yellow pleates and ruffles. The flowers
have lovely green throats. Three-way branched scapes bear 15 buds and
plants repeat their bloom cycle. Fertile both ways.



EVIL GNOME - \$100 - Murphy 2011 - 45 DIP Dor Mid6" - Very
eye-catching and different! Cream to light tan in the morning, with a light
purple jagged eye pattern. Tiny purple edge on the petals, chartreuse throat,
and sunfast to 100F. On hot days it turns cream. 3 branches plus terminal,
and about 27 buds. Vigorous, fertile. Out of GREY WITCH by a Jack
Carpenter patterned seedling. Excellent parent for unusual patterned kids.

FACEPAINT - \$25 - Stamile, P 2006 -25 ERe. SEv 5.5" Orchid cream with
a black violet eye and edge. Prolific bloomer and increaser. Donated by
Carol Sarginger.



FAME - \$75 - Smith, F. 2006 - 26" EM Dor TET 6" RE- Dark carmine rose
flower with large chartreuse eye and edge. Donated by Carol Sarginger.



FANCY FACE - \$15 - Carpenter 1994 - 22" DIP Ev EMid 5.5" - Cream gold
with dark mahogany eyezone above green throat. Donated by Roma Radford.



FEEL THE MAGIC - \$75 - Shooter 2005 - DIP SEv EMid DBL 5" - bronze blush above olive green to yellow throat. Donated by Kim Langston.



FOCUS - \$75 - Murphy, 2010 - 39MLa7dormant diploid ext.fr.3 branches, 23 buds. - Black purple with a black band, chartreuse throat, and ruffled edges;diamond dusted.Unusually sunfast for a dark color and a seaof blooms in the late season. Fertile. (Dont Know Jack x Chief Black Hand) The only cultivar with this parentage, and an excellent parent. Hard Dormant. Donated by Jim Murphy.



FRINGED SANGRIA - \$100 - Petit, T.2009 -27" Mid Sev. 7" These flowers are warm coral pink doubles with orange and rose highlights. At the center of the flower is a darker eye, which is present on both the petals and petaloids. The darker eye also continues along the petals and petaloids as a dark picotee. Surrounding the picotee edge is a second gold edge, which is typically bubbly, with hooks and knobs. The petals and petaloids are also very ruffled and crimped. The flowers appear atop strong, nicely branched scapes. The overall effect is very showy.



GET JIGGY - \$120 - Stamile, P.2009 -37" TETEMDor5.75 RE -WOW, What a flower!! Basically pink with a violet rose eye and double edges of both violet and rose. It is the eye, though, with its myriad breaks in color forming designer patterns of intriguing complexity. The eye of GET JIGGY is never the same. While the eye can be occasionally solid it is generally broken into layers. I have seen as many as 9 bands of alternating color (the image shows 7 bands). The lighter bands occasionally take on metallic characteristics. Unlike most patterned eyes the complexity of the eye seems to be independent of the temperature, with seedlings showing the breaking eye.Fertile both ways.



GODDESS DIVINE - \$75 - Petit, T.2009 -25" Mid Sev. 6" -delicate clear medium lavender pink. The petals are ruffled and surrounded by a crimped gold edge. The ruffled gold edges also decorate and highlight the petaloids, which makes the flower glow. The flowers of Goddess Divine provide a soft, peaceful spot in the garden. Reminiscent of a prom dress, these lovely pink flowers sparkle in the sunlight.



GOODBYE GENERAL CUSTER - \$15 - Roberts, N. 2003 - 44" DIP Mid SEv 8" RE UFO - Raspberry with red eye above green throat. Donated by David Metzger.



HAGRID - \$100 - Petit 2008 - Sev. 7-8 fl. 30 sc. M 25-30 buds. These monster-size flowers make other gold edged lavenders look like miniatures. The color varies between a dark lavender and light purple, accented by a deep green throat surrounded by a lighter watermark. The gold edge is deeply ruffled, and the flowers are presented on tall, well branched scapes. A great garden show-piece and an important breeder for size in the purple to lavender lines.



HEAT LIGHTNING - \$15 - Reed, M. 1994 - 40" DIP Mid Dor 6" RE - Deep dark purple with velvety black pencil mark above yellow to green throat. Donated by David Metzger.



JASON SALTER - \$15 - Salter, EH 1987 - 18" DIP EMid Ev 3" - Yellow with washed lavender purple eyezone and green throat. Donated by Kim Langston.



JEALOUS DANCER - \$35 - Carpenter 2007 - 30" DIP Dor Early 5" RE - Peach with mahogany eye above green throat. Donated by BRADS Daylily Club.



KAREN MUIR - \$50 - Smith, F.2006 - 28" TETSEv 5.5" KAREN MUIR is a brilliant pinkish lavender flower with a very dark red-purple eye that radiates outward over the petals. The matching red-purple edge defines this perfectly-formed flat flower. Fertile both ways. Donated by Becci Dougherty.



LONDON LEE - \$100 - Petit, T.2008 -30" Mid Sev. 6- A most striking patterned flower. The iridescent applique throat forms a shocking contrast to the dark, bold purple patterned eye. The petal edges lift in the throat area, displaying the dramatically mimicked applique and purple pattern on the sepals. Adding to the overall complexity of the flower is a matching dark purple picotee edge surrounded by a ruffled gold edge, typically with gold hooks and horns.



LAST SONG - \$100 - Petit,T.2009 -33" Mid SEv 6" - both captivating and serene at the same time. The petal self is a pale cream lavender, with a deep green throat. The flower has a striking triangular patterned eye, which is mimicked on the sepals. The eye is a violet lavender that is made up of two distinct bands: an inner and outer darker lavender mascara band. Between the bands is a lighter lavender violet eye, which contains inward streaking. The flowers are covered in a heavy diamond dusting, sparkling in the sunlight. The overall effect is quite amazing.



LAVA FLOW - \$45 - Smith 2006 - 32" TET EM SEv 5.5" - Intense brilliant orange with small red eye and edge. Donated by Carol Sarginger.



MINT OCTOPUS - \$50 - Stamile, P.2009 -32 TET EMEv8 RE- Beautiful LONG PETALED mint green blend.Incredible bud count and branching. Its green cast offers a cooling aspect to the ordinarily hot colors of the daylily garden.Fertile both ways.



ORCHID GILDED RUFFLES - \$50 - Carpenter, J. 2007 - 18" M Dor TET 5.5" RE - Orchid blend with orchid and yellow edge. Donated by Carol Sarginger.



PENDERGRIFF SPOON RIVER ANTHOLOGY - \$75 - GRIFFIN, RANDY 2009 - (White Temptation x Unknown) is one of Randy's first intros. 27" Dor 5" REDip UFO Spatulate - Melon with darker watermark and lighter midribs above green throat. 4 branches, 30 buds. Indiana hybridizer. Donated by Angie Bowald.



PUNXSUTAWNEY PHIL - \$20 - Trimmer 2003 - 34" TET EMid Ev 7.75" - Yellow with wine plum eye. Donated by Genie Cate.



PURPLE EYED FANTASY - \$25 - Carpenter 1994 - 22" EM DIP Ev 5.5" - Cream gold with dark mahogany eyezone above green throat.



RED FANG - \$20 - Stamile 2001 - 28" TET EMid Ev 6" - Red self with gold edge and teeth above green throat. Donated by Kim Langston.



REFLEX - \$90 - Murphy 2011 -30 M 6 SEV diploid Unusual Form Cascade -What a surprise from this one - it opens at midnight with dark red tepals and huge dark green throat, and as the day progresses, it reflexes or curls back until mainly the throat shows. The tepals curl and re-curl. Cream edge, yellow midrib.Sunfast at 100F, Opens well at 50F. Fertile, out of (YABBA DABBA DOO X DEVILS ADVOCATE) xNATHAN SOMMERSWith this parentage, it might not be hardy in zones 4 and under, but completely hardy here with no winter damage. REGAL BRAID - \$8 - Stamile 1994 - TET 12" Dor Mid 6" RE - Cream lavender with braided purple edge and purple eyezone above green throat.



REVOLUTION - \$150 - Reed, 2011 - 50+MLa&dormant, diploid, Unusual Form -Exotic Ruby red, with a darker red eye and a large yellow-to-green throat, this bloom is a huge cascade Unusual Form.It can easily reach 60, with 2-3 way branching and a bud count of about 16.This one stands up to thunderstorms and impulse sprinklers, but not recommended for high wind areas.Its tall, huge form would tempt the winds! It is a variable form (would measure larger but it recurves and cascades), ruffled and curling.Holds up to sun and 100 degree temps fine.Parentage:(ASD seedlingxKirsten Madeline Burkey). RINGS OF WONDER - \$150 - Stamile, P.2009 -28 TETESEv 5.5" RE -somewhat of a misnomer since the rings of color sometimes appear as pointed metallic chevrons of color along with the more traditional rings. The color is basically a cream yellow with a multicolor eye of plum and lavender. The eye sometimes can appear to be bands of deep lavender and light lavender as the plum morphs into a more lavender mode. Fertile both ways but a difficult pod parent.



RUSSIAN TEMPLE - \$100 - Petit, T. 2007 -26" TET Mid Sev. 5.5- The self color on these striking flowers is a tangerine to lemon orange with a unique patterned eye of bright orange red, green throat. The circular eye moves out along the midribs to form points that resemble the peaks of a Russian temple. The eye is surrounded by a darker red mascara band highlighting its unique shape. The pattern eye continues around the beautifully ruffled petal edges as a double picotee surrounded by a third gold edge.



SANFORD ROSE CROWN - \$25 - Kirchoff 2002 - 22" TET Mid Ev 6" RE DBL - Coral rose DOUBLE with apricot to green throat and deep ruffles on petals. Donated by Richard and Jayne Dittman.



SASKATOON - \$50 - Reed, 09 - 36" M 6" dormant, diploid. Ext. - Rich orchid purple, with great ruffles, this daylily has a big splash of a feathered darker purple eye, and some white in the throat. It has good branching (2 to 3-way) and bud count of 15-20. It blooms over a long season and is somewhat variable in form, hence was not registered as an unusual form, unlike its sibling FLIGHT OF ORCHIDS. It is sometimes a pinched crispate, other times a relaxed exotic form, or close to a cascade. The color carries across the garden. It is easily fertile both ways. One parent was an unusual form Jack Carpenter seedling. Donated by Margo Reed.

SAVANNAH SECHRIST BEAUTY - \$15 - Brown, C 1993 - 21" DIP Mid SEv DBL 5" - Purple self with yellow gold throat. Donated by Genie Cate. Link to picture:

SCREAMCICLE - \$40 - Cochenour 2003 - 35" TET EMid Dor 8" RE UF - Orange with red orange eye above orange throat. Donated by Tracy Mundy.



SHENANDOAH DUSK - \$75 - Reed, 2011 - 45EM7.5dormant, diploid, Unusual Form -This light purple cascade with a very green throat began in early June, and is finishing at the end of July (a bud builder!).A cool color, with diamond dusting, it recurves and cascades.2-way branching with a bud count of about 20. Donated by Margo Reed.



SITTING QUEEN - \$100 - Petit, T.2009 -30" TET Mid SEv. 5.5 - 6" complex patterned and applique eye, with both a mascara edge and inward streaking. For even more pazazz, the patterned eye continues around the petal edges as a multi-edged picotee, surrounded by a third wire gold edge. All of this patterning is overlaid on a lavender to orchid peach self with a deep green throat. The final result is a mesmerizing flower that glows in the garden.



SMALL WORLD TROI WAYNE - \$40 - Miller, M. 2007 - 28" TET Mid Ev 5 1/2" RE - Light yellow blooms with thick substance have a wide gold edge that shows some green on cooler mornings. Five way branching shows each bloom to perfection. Fertile both ways, pollen is easy, pods more difficult. Donated by Angie Bowald.



SMOKE SCREAM - \$20 - Gossardd 2004 - 42" DIP Dor Mid UF 6.5" - Purple blend with dark purple eye above green white throat. Donated by Roma Radford.



SOCKEYE SUNRISE - \$35 - Kendig 2003 - 38" TET EM Dor 6" - Salmon with dark pink eye and thread gold edge. Donated by Angie Bowald.



SPOTTED FEVER - \$10 - Brown-Oakes 1995 - 22" DIP SEv Mid DBL 4" - Tan peach peony SPOTTED blend DOUBLE with lime green throat. Donated by Angie Bowald.



SUPER FANCY FACE - \$150 - Carpenter, J.2009- 27" Mid DIP EV 5" RE FRA - This cultivar and TEXAS KALEIDOSCOPE have produced some of the best of the kaleidoscopic eyed seedlings. five-way branching with up to 39 buds. Scapes are strong and have flowers that have a rather distinctive look to them. Please note the etching patterns on the eye as it appears on the sepals. This trait is easily passed to its seedlings. SUPER FANCY FACE has been foundational in working with the kaleidoscopic eyes and it is fertile both ways.



TEXAS CARNIVAL DANCE - \$35 - Carpenter, J.2007 -28" DIP E Ev 5" RE
-Looking at a clump of this brightly colored little flower one is given the impression of joy and frivolity, happiness and dancing. The flowers just seem to be spinning around and whirling as in a dance spin. TEXAS CARNIVAL DANCE is one of our earliest bloomers and repeats well and is in full bloom now at the end of June. Scapes have 5-way branching with 23 buds and repeat. Fertile both ways.



TUTU TRUFFLE - \$40 - Kirchoff 2004 - 30" TET Mid Ev RE DBL 5" -
Blend of cantaloupe, coral, apricot, tangerine, peach colors - DOUBLE.

WARRIOR VICTORIOUS - \$60 - Carpenter, J.2007 - 26" TET EMid SEv 5.5" RE -The base color of the flower is a deep or royal magenta present on both sepals and petals. To add special accent and detail there is a wide yellow band edge on the sepals along with the same color yellow appearing on the sepals back as they go under the petals. WARRIOR VICTORIOUS continues its impact with wide, bold, lavender-blue watermarks on the petals. The petals have a whitish-gold edging on them. Branching is 3-way with 15 buds and scapes repeat. Fertile both ways.



WATCHYL CYBER SPIDER - \$20 - Kreger 1995 - 30" Mid Dor TET 12" SPIDER - Pale yellow with red eyezone and green throat. Picture displayed is of first bloom a month after being transplanted. Red eyezone developed into much strongereye as summer progressed. Donated by Angie Bowald.



WATER DROPS - \$95 - Stamile, P.2009 -29 TET EEEv. 5 RE -has an eye that normally looks like stained glass. The eye itself varies considerably but always involved colors of blue, charcoal, fuchsia and lavender. The image shows a typical bloom but the eye can vary anything from bands of color to solid. The water drops can vary from light blue lavender to white. Occasionally the water drops also become a metallic diamond dusted gray. WATER DROPS is one of the most eagerly awaited daylilies since it was pictured in The Journal and Daylily Encyclopedia. An amazing daylily that passes on stained glass eyes. Fertile both ways.



WITCHES BREW - \$45 - Courturier 1990 - 36" Dip Dor Mid 7" Spider -
Brick red spider with darker red eyezone and gold throat. Donated by David Metzger.



WONDER WORKER - \$80 - Carpenter, J.2007 - 24" DIP EMid Ev 6.5" RE -Flowers are round and very flat-faced with gorgeous pie crust type of ruffling. The substance of the flowers is unusually heavy. The beautiful cream color has a pink blushing in it, with scapes that are strong and sturdy with 4-way branching and 30 buds. Fertile both ways.



YELLOW MONKEY - \$80 - Gossard 2006 - 37" Mid Dip Spider 8.5" RE - Bright yellow spider, huge bud count, great branching. Donated by Angie Bowald.



ZOE ALLEGRA - \$150 - Petit, T.2009 -30" TET EMid Sev. 5.5"one of the most mysterious flowers that I have ever grown. The lavender blooms have a pattern eye that contains many colors, from violet to charcoal, mahogany, white, and green. The pattern itself changes daily. It can appear as clear distinct bands, as pictured, creating the effect of a kaleidoscope, or a flower within a flower. On other days, it can appear quite exotic, with many, many ripples of blue violet, giving it the garden name of pebble in a pond. The petals lift in the center of the flower revealing the pattern mimicked on the sepals. To add ornate to exotic, the flowers also have a violet picotee, surrounded by a second, knobby wire gold edge. A sinfully fertile, awesome parent! Named for a delightful young lady in St. Catherines, Ontario.
