**1 SOARING BIRD** - Display Only - (Roberts-N., 2009) Height 30", bloom 6", season M, Dormant, Diploid, 30 buds, 4 branches, UFO Crispate, Yellow with burnt rose edge above vivid green throat. (unknown unknown) When Soaring Bird was initially selected in Florida, it was 52". In 2011, the two scapes were 42" and 46" in my garden. Looking forward to seeing what it will do next year. Love the upright foliage. Holding for increase, it has not been introduced yet and is very, very RARE.

**1 SOARING BIRD FOLIAGE** - Display Only - This image was not taken in the spring as the foliage emerged. It was taken in the fall and you can see how upright it is, rather than the normal arching foliage.



**1 SOARING BIRD HEIGHT** - Display Only - This image was taken in FL and you can see that it does indeed soar above the rest!



**ABIQUA DRINKING GOURD** - \$13 - Walden West (R)1989 Plant: 14 in. (36 cm) diameter, 16 in. (41 cm) high. What a classic plant!



**A GREEN DESIRE** - \$30 - (White-D., 2006) Height 25", bloom 7.5", season M, Rebloom, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, 18 buds, 5 branches, UFO Cascade, Light yellow near white blend above lime yellow throat. (sdlg Jan's Twister) Price is for double fan.



**AMERICAN SWEETHEART** - \$16 - H. Hansen (ONIR)2002 Plant: 24 in. (61 cm) diameter, 20 in. (51 cm) high; upright; slow growth. Taken in very early spring, the colors will become more dramatic as the season changes.



**ATHYRIUM FILIX-FEMINA 'FRIZELLIAE'** - Display Only - GREAT companion plant, commonly known as the "Tatting Fern." There IS a hosta called Tatting Fern, but this isn't it.:) Great grower in my zone 5 garden, seems to be oblivious to pests or drought. Not for sale at this time.



**AUTUMN MINARET** - Display Only - Award of Merit candidate. Despite being moved this spring, this cultivar is blooming as the champ it is. It's not the form that's great, it's the performance that it delivers which has earned it as a favorite spot in so many gardeners' hearts.



**BACKSTROKE** - \$10 - (Sobek, 1990) Height 39", bloom 2.5", season M, Dormant,, Yellow self with dark maroon on back of petals. (TOY TRUMPETS SDLG) NOTE: This plant should not be in a mass planting to be effective, as the bloom is very, very small (and cute.)



**BEWARE THE WIZARD** - Display Only - (Couturier-G., 1995) Height 37", bloom 8", season M, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, Spider Ratio 4.40:1, Double , Polymerous 75%, Orange red with dark red eyezone above a gold throat. (DOUBLE BOW TIE FIRESTORM)



**BLAYNE ATTRACTION** - \$40 - (Warrell, 2003) Height 34", bloom 9", season MLa, Dormant, Diploid, 15 buds, 3 branches, Spider Ratio 4.25:1, Deep gold self above green throat. (Carolicolossal Asiatic Pheasant). If you like them bold, big and late, this is the one for you! Price is for full sized double fan.



**BLUE ARROW** - \$8 - K. Anderson (R)1982 24 in. (61 cm) diameter, 18 in. (46 cm) high. This is one of the oldest residents of my garden. WHAT a beauty! You are guaranteed a nice piece.:)



**BLUE CADET** - \$5 - P. Aden (R)1974 12 in. (30 cm) diameter, 4 in. (10 cm) high. This pic was taken in very early May in my Zone 5 garden. Please note: Blue Cadet doesn't normally grow this way. I have some daffodils planted wayyy too close to it.:)



**BLUE HAWAII** - \$16 - O. Petryszyn (ONIR)1999 Plant: 42 in. (107 cm) diameter, 30 in. (76 cm) high; upright; fast. Leaf: 10 in. (25 cm) long, 8 in. (20 cm) wide; 11 to 13 pairs of veins; intensely blue green; glaucous bloom on top; glaucous bloom underneath; cordate base; Scape: 42 to 46 in. (107 cm) long; blue. Flower: 1.25 in. (3.67 cm) long; bell; Chesterton, IN - July 1 - August 10; Seed: sets viable seed;blue green seed pod; [H. 'Bengee' x H. 'Sagae' H. 'Tokudama Aureonebulosa']



**BRENDA'S BEAUTY** - \$14 - R. Keller (OR)1992 Plant: 26 in. (66 cm) diameter, 15 in. (38 cm) high; Leaf: 8 in. (20 cm) long, 5 in. (13 cm) wide; 8 pairs of veins; light yellow; medium green streaked margin; dull on top; rounded base; Scape: 24 in. (61 cm) long; Flower: tubular; Illinois - July; [Sport of H. 'Gold Standard'] Pic taken in early May.



**BREER RABBIT'S BABY** - Display Only - Great grower with good budcount. Its form and color saturation always please!



**BRIDEGROOM** - \$13 - H. & D. Benedict & H. Gowen (R)1990 Plant: 10 in. (25 cm) diameter, 8 in. (20 cm) high; Leaf: 5 in. (13 cm) long, 4 in. (10 cm) wide; 6 to 7 pairs of veins; dark green; small undulations; satiny sheen on top; Scape: 18 in. (46 cm) long; Flower: Michigan - July - early August; Seed: sets pod; [H. 'Holly's Honey' H. 'Holly's Honey']



**BR NO. 15** - Display Only - This Ned seedling was selected for introduction in 2008, but that didnt happen. 4 , 24 Ht, maroon, 19 BC, 3-way branching in FL. Please note the vast difference between this seedling and Long Tall Sally one of my favorite pics!:)



**BR NO. 15 - VIEW 2** - Display Only - The intense curling and the unbelievable green throat are outstanding. I love the green on the inner sepals!



**BR NO. 2** - Display Only - This Ned seedling was selected for introduction in 2008, but that didn't happen. FL stats: Early, 4, 21 Ht, dark purple, yellow/green throat, curly sepals, 13 BC in FL. Definitely higher BC up north, but someone/something cut off the top part of the most mature scape this year. Secondary branch had 10 buds. Extremely good substance and all around good plant. Fertile both ways. My personal favorite among the small dark reds and purples, this image shows more red than the deep purple that my eye sees.



**BR NO. 3** - Display Only - [NR-JPS03] This Ned seedling was selected for introduction in 2008, but that didn't happen. 5, 32 Ht, purple, yellow/green throat, twisty sepals, reflexed petals, 13 BC, 3-way branching in FL. (May be higher up north(?))



**CABARET STAR** - \$10 - (Saxton, 1977) Height 24", bloom 5", season MLa, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, Bright cherry red self with yellow green throat. (SDLG WAR EAGLE)



**CAMEROONS** - Display Only - (Munson-R.W., 1984) Height 28", bloom 5", season M, Rebloom, Evergreen, Tetraploid, Claret self with yellow green throat. (Siamese Royalty Royal Heritage)



**CAMEROONS TWISTER** - Display Only - (Benz, 2000) Height 40", bloom 7.5", season MLa, Rebloom, Dormant, Tetraploid, Fragrant, 40 buds, 5 branches, Unusual Form Crispate, Wine purple with pale watermark and eye above green throat. (Cameroons One Step Beyond) Excellent plant in my yard, fertile both ways. I've been working on getting that watermark and twisting onto longer petaled daylilies.



**CAROLINA OCTOPUS** - Display Only - (Baxter, 2002) Height 28", bloom 10", season E, Dormant, Diploid, Spider Ratio 4.17:1, Polymerous 65%, Deep vibrant red with green eye and throat. (Starman's Fantasy sdlg)



**CHALK TALK** - \$50 - (Warrell, 2006) Height 32", bloom 8.75", season EM, Dormant, Diploid, 14 buds, 2 branches, UF Crispate, Light rose with darker brushed chevron eye above green throat. ((Spiral Charmer Parade of Peacocks) (Starsearch Jazz)) The absolute star of my garden in 2009, with TWICE as many branches and buds as what is registered! Just look at the "crown" of buds! Very limited availability due to digging in 2010. Price is for double fan+. Hybridizer is currently sold out.



**CHARLINE MOORE** - Display Only - This is not registered as a poly, but it sometimes does.



**CHARTRES** - Display Only - The color is not as saturated as the image suggests, but the color combination is a very ethereal mix that grabs just about everyone who sees it. Sometimes polys and is very pod fertile.



**CHARTRES X PLACE D'ETOILE** - Display Only - The substance of this dip is outstanding.



**CHATEAU D'IF** - \$15 - (Lambert, 1990) Height 24", bloom 6", season E, Dormant, Diploid, Dark purple with white midribs and green throat. (Isolde Faustus) Polys about 20-30% of the time. Price is for double fan+.



**CHEROKEE PATTERNS** - Display Only - Cleopatra used to be a favorite for its bold eye, however, it does not survive well in the north. This, in my humble opinion, should be the new standard.



**CHICAGO SILVER** - Display Only - (Marsh, 1973) Height 30", bloom 6", season M, Semi-Evergreen, Tetraploid, Purple edged silver with darker eyezone and green throat. (sdlg Chicago Two Bits) My original theory of working with tets was to go back to the early narrow-petaled things that do well up north for me. I still have a few around.~)



**CHIEF FOUR FINGERS** - \$15 - (Roberts-N., 2002) Height 44", bloom 6", season M, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, 16 buds, 4 branches, Polymerous 80%, Dark red purple with black eye above yellow green throat. Price is for double fan+, limited availability.



**CHIN WHISKERS** - \$10 - (McRae, 1992) Height 20", bloom 5", season EM, Rebloom, Dormant, Diploid, Ufo Crispate, Lavender pink spider blend with large green throat.



**CHI-TOWN CLASSIC** - \$19 - M. Zilis (OR) Northern Illinois Hosta Society (NI)2009 31 in. (79 cm) diameter, 11 in. (28 cm) high; mound-like; medium growth. Mark Zilis has identified this as a medium rate grower? Not in my garden - it's been one of the very fastest multipliers and you will be getting more than 2 eyes.:)



**CHOKO NISHIKI** - \$19 - K. Watanabe (ONI) AHS, K. Walek (R)2009 Plant: 48 in. (122 cm) diameter, 22 in. (56 cm) high; upright; slow growth. Not a slow grower for me, it has flourished under trying circumstances in my garden. Excellent substance!



**CINCY'S PAT HENLEY** - Display Only - (Bachman, 2007) Height 35", bloom 4.5", season M, Dormant, Diploid, 20 buds, 3 branches, Reddish purple with darker halo above yellow green throat. (sdlg Charon the Ferryman)



**CLASSY LADY** - Display Only - (Warrell, 2005) Height 32", bloom 8.5", season M, Dormant, Diploid, 22 buds, 5 branches, UFO Crispate, Flamingo pink above green yellow throat. (Pink Cricket (Lake Norman Spider Starsearch))



**COPPER PENNY** - \$10 - (Lambert, 1988) Height 28", bloom 3", season M, Dormant,, Copper with red eyezone and gold green throat. (WILLIS AND HATTIE CAMPTOWN RACES)



**CORAL TACO** - \$30 - (Roberts-N., 2004) Height 30", bloom 10", season M, Rebloom, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, 16 buds, 4 branches, Spider Ratio 7.50:1, Raspberry coral cream bitone above yellow green throat. Due to the large size and consistent excellent form, 2011 was the year that I spread its pollen liberally. It is also pod fertile and I was rewarded generously. Can't wait to see what it can produce!



**COUNTESS OF CUTE** - Display Only - (Roberts-N., 2009) Height 28", bloom 5.75", season MLa, Dormant, Diploid, 17 buds, 5 branches, UFo Crispate, Rose bitone with yellow pale ruffled edge above green throat. (unknown unknown) Countess of Cute is one of the most recent registrations of Ned Roberts and has yet to be released.



**DAMSEL IN DISTRESS** - Display Only - (Lambert, 1985) Height 30", bloom 7", season M, Dormant, Diploid, Very Fragrant, Purple self with green throat. (Ancient Art Ethel Ruthrauff) I'm always a bit surprised when I see DID, because its wonderful dark color reminds me so much of Ned Roberts' John's Heritage. There's a reason for that - DID is the pod parent of John's Heritage.



**DANCE WITH ME** - \$14 - H. Hansen (ONR) Shady Oaks Nursery (I) 2002 Plant: 36 in. (91 cm) diameter, 20 in. (51 cm) high; mound-like; medium growth. Humongous Mississippi Delta is crowding this one out. It would love to go to your yard and elsewhere in mine!



**DATE BOOK** - Display Only - (Wild, 1971) Height 40", bloom 6", season EM, Rebloom, Dormant, Diploid, Baby ribbon pink with tangerine throat. One of the first daylilies that started my addiction, it was given to me by a very sweet club member.



**DAWN'S EARLY LIGHT** - \$16 - O. Petryszyn (ONIR)1998 Plant: 36 in. (91 cm) diameter, 20 in. (51 cm) high; moderate. Leaf: 9 in. (23 cm) long, 8 in. (20 cm) wide; 12 pairs of veins; pale yellow; heavy ripples; dull on top; dull underneath; cordate base; Scape: 29 to 31 in. (74 cm) long; Flower: 1.5 in. (4.31 cm) long; tubular; Chesterton, IN - July 15 - July 28; [Hybrid of H. 'Sea Fire'] "The first year they sleep; the second year they creep and the third year they leap." She is still in the process of leafing out on May 5, but I can tell that this is truly Dawn's leap year!



**DESTINED TO SEE** - Display Only - (Grace-L., 1998) Height 24", bloom 6", season EM, Evergreen, Tetraploid, Fragrant, UFO , Cream yellow with lavender eye and edge above yellow green throat. (sdlg Create Your Dream)



**DINETIZA** - Display Only - (Mayo-D., 1973) Height 30", bloom 7.5", season M, Dormant,, Cherry red self with olive throat. (GALA SEASON ANNIE WELCH) NOTE: This may be an oldie, but it's a screamer in the garden, is not readily available from other sellers and is one of my all-time favorites!



**DIVINE DESIGN** - Display Only - (Warrell, 2000) Height 28", bloom 6", season E, Dormant, Diploid, 30 buds, 3 branches, Unusual Form Crispate, Cream rose orchid with cream lime green veins. (Fun Fling (So Lovely Yellow Ribbon))



**DON'T KNOW JACK** - Display Only - This one always kept me guessing, because its form is so unusual, it didn't seem to know which way it wanted to head every day it bloomed. Always the personality.



**DRESS BLUES** - \$13 - Normal 0 MicrosoftInternetExplorer4 W. Zumbar (OR)1995 36 in. (91 cm) diameter, 24 in. (61 cm) high; open, upright; fast growth.



**D X CC (DAISY X CAT'S CRADLE)** - Display Only - This has gained enough attention, I am proud to feature it on the 2012 National in Cindy Osmans Lady Hybridizers Bed. The flower is only 5-6, but it is sweet, sweet, sweet! Just look at those ruffles! Height is proportionate, about 28. Pod difficult, pollen fertile.



**EIGHT DAYS A WEEK - A** - Display Only - New to the garden in '08, it was well worth the wait to see it bloom. Consistently polys, pod and very pollen fertile!

**EL NINO** - \$14 - P.Th. Warmerdam (ONIR)2003 Plant: 30 in. (76 cm) diameter, 20 in. (51 cm) high; upright; medium. Leaf: 7 in. (17 cm) long, 5 in. (12 cm) wide; 9 to 11 pairs of veins; (RHS 188A & 133B) intensely blue green (center) and slightly blue green (between the center and marg; (RHS155D) pure white margin; slightly rippled; dull on top; dull underneath; moderately wavy; ovate; cordate base; petiole is center medium green (RHS191A) margin white (RHS 19. Scape: 23.5 in. (60 cm) long; Flower: 1.6 to 2 in. (4.56 cm) long; striped; bell; Noordwijk, The Netherlands - July 15 to Aug 15; Clump History: original seedling; 5 yrs old; Noordwijk, The Netherlands; Notable Characteristics: dull leaves; thick and sturdy [H. 'Halcyon' unknown] All I can say is WHATTA PLANT! Pic to come!



**FAITHFUL HEART** - \$13 - K. Brill (ONIR)1999 Leaf: 3 in. (6 cm) long, 2 in. (5 cm) wide; golden yellow; medium green margin. Sorry, the image is a bit too green for words.:



**FAUSTUS** - \$20 - (Lambert, 1987) Height 32", bloom 7", season EM, Dormant, Diploid, Dark mahogany with deeper eyezone and yellow green throat. ((Black Forrest Ethel Ruthrauff) Idiots Delight) Faustus is a low percentage poly. It's a strong grower, decent branching with a very strong scape. Pod fertile, however I have not tried its pollen. Price is for double fan.



**FIVE O'CLOCK SOMEWHERE** - \$27 - R. Solberg (ONIR)2004 Plant: 20 in. (51 cm) diameter, 32 in. (81 cm) high; mound-like; medium.(Pic was taken in late fall, so the plant is showing some wear and tear. I'll try to get a better one this year.:))Purchased from the hybridizer back in 2006, it's a great grower, already divided once since I purchased it. Very limited availability, double eye guaranteed!



**FLEUR DE ROCAILLE** - Display Only - (Whitacre-JA., 1988) Height 30", bloom 4", season M, Dormant, Diploid, Bright blue pink and pale yellow dusted pink bitone with cerise and deep cream eyezone above green throat. ((Frances FayE Evelyn Claar) (Dorcus Ringlets)) Just look at the color and the size! Good budcount!



**FOUR-PLAY** - Display Only - A consistent poly-er, pod difficult, but do-able. Pollen fertile. Great substance.



**FOXHAVEN ENIGMA** - Display Only - (Bowman, 1998) Height 27", bloom 6.5", season M, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, 15 buds, 2 branches, Plum blend with thin white edge and purple beige band above yellow throat. (sdlg Black Plush) Please check for availability.



**FRAGRANT BOUQUET** - \$12 - P. Aden (R)1982 Plant: 26 in. (66 cm) diameter, 18 in. (46 cm) high; Leaf: 6 in. (15 cm) long, 4 in. (11 cm) wide; 7 pairs of veins; light green streaked; Scape: 36 in. (91 cm) long; Flower: flattened trumpets; New York - July 10 - peaks August 1; [H. 'Fascination' H. 'Summer Fragrance'] This clump is showing both the smooth leaves, as well as the puckered of a mature plant.



**FROSTED JADE** - \$13 - L. Maroushek (R)1978 Plant: 36 in. (91 cm) diameter, 28 in. (71 cm) high; Leaf: 13 in. (33 cm) long, 9 in. (23 cm) wide; 10 to 12 pairs of veins; dark jade green; creamy white margin; undulations; Scape: 30 in. (76 cm) long; Flower: pale lavender buds; Minnesota - early - late July; [Hybrid of H. montana 'Krossa B-1'] Personally, I think that Frosted Jade is much more attractive than Jade Cascade. Oldies CAN be goodies!



**FUNKY MONKEY** - Display Only - (Schwarz-B., 2005) Height 34", bloom 5.5", season MLa, Rebloom, Dormant, Tetraploid, 40 buds, 4 branches, Dark lavender self above green throat. (Riddle Me This Wiggles Worth) I received this as a gift plant at the National in '07, best gift plant I've ever received! Very nice budcount and contrary to Bob Schwarz' comment, has been very fertile for me both ways, but does not rebloom for me. Try as hard as I could to get a good pic, this pic is too saturated.



**GADSDEN FIREFLY** - Display Only - This is a very small bloom, but heavy on the branching!



**GADSDEN FIREFLY** - Display Only - (Reinke-B., 2004) Height 34", bloom 3.5", season E, Dormant, Diploid, Fragrant, 35 buds, 5 branches, Golden copper blend with gold edge above orange throat. (sdlg Nutmeg Elf) Extremely fertile both ways.



**GEMSTONE** - \$18 - T. Avent (ONIR)2005 Plant: 24 in. (61 cm) diameter, 10 in. (25 cm) high; mound-like; medium. Leaf: 4 in. (10 cm) long, 3 in. (8 cm) wide; 6 to 7 pairs of veins; intensely blue-green; slightly rippled; glaucous bloom on top; glaucous bloom underneath; lightly cupped, lightly wavy; broadly ovate; cordate base; petiole is ridge on sides of petiole (winged). Flower: tubular; Raleigh, NC - June 1 to July 15; Clump History: original seedling; 6 yrs old; Raleigh, NC; Notable Characteristics: vigorous small blue [H. venusta H. 'Dorset Blue'] This plant is new to the garden this year and seems to be on the young side. However, it's so nicely advanced, I am pleased to offer only ONE double eye this year. VERY heavy substance

and really nice blue!



**GHOST RANCH** - Display Only - (Roberts-Roberts, 2007) Height 38", bloom 9", season M, Rebloom, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, 15 buds, 3 branches, Spider Ratio 4.00:1, White self above lime green throat. (unknown unknown) To my eye, Ghost Ranch has very little yellow in it. Fertile both ways. Not widely grown yet, it is a RARE plant.



**GRAND PRIZE - AUGUST** - \$12 - Dramatic color change!



**GRAND PRIZE - EARLY SPRING** - \$12 - Walters Gardens, Inc. (ONIR) 1998 Leaf: 5 in. (11 cm) long, 4 in. (9 cm) wide; 7 to 8 pairs of veins; medium green; pale yellow margin; flat; dull on top; dull underneath. Grand Prize is indeed a Grand Prize - very colorful in the spring.



**GUACAMOLE** - \$12 - Normal 0 MicrosoftInternetExplorer4 R. Solberg (OR)1994 18 in. (46 cm) diameter, 10 in. (25 cm) high; open, semi-upright. This plant has been here so long and is so big, I nearly killed myself trying to move it!



**HACKSAW** - \$16 - R. Livingston Not registered. Low grower, fast grower. You can see that it's being crowded, but still blooming profusely through its neighbor's leaves.



**HADSPEN BLUE** - \$9 - Normal 0 MicrosoftInternetExplorer4 E. Smith & P. Ruh (R)1976 Plant: 10 in. (25 cm) diameter, 8 in. (20 cm) high. Normal 0 MicrosoftInternetExplorer4 Not only is it a fast grower, it is VERY hardy. By accident, it spent the winter the year I received it in my garage! No water, no light. Yet, the next spring, it was still alive. You can see that it is a very, very happy clump.



**HALCYON** - \$8 - Normal 0 MicrosoftInternetExplorer4 E. Smith & BHHS (R)1988 23 in. (58 cm) diameter, 21 in. (53 cm) high



**HAPPY HOPI** - Display Only - (Roberts-N., 1994) Height 40", bloom 6", season EM, Dormant, Diploid, UFO Crispate, Yellow green blend with green throat. (Pink Super Spider Spider Miracle)



**HAPPY RETURNS** - \$10 - (Apps, 1986) Height 18", bloom 3.12", season EE, Dormant, Diploid, Fragrant, Light yellow self. (SUSIE WONG STELLA DE ORO) NOTE: Best known for its rebloom!



**HARRY CAREY** - \$15 - (Reinke-B., 1998) Height 35", bloom 8.5", season ML, Dormant, Diploid, Fragrant, 20 buds, 3 branches, Red and yellow with dark red eye and yellow edge above chartreuse throat. (GREEN WIDOW sdlg) Are there any Cub fans out there?



**HELIX** - Display Only - (Stamile, 2002) Height 33", bloom 9", season EE, Rebloom, Evergreen, Tetraploid, 30 buds, 5 branches, Spider Ratio 4.33:1, Bordeaux red above green throat. (Inky Fingers Web Browser) Not as big as Web Browser, but fertile both ways.



**HIGH SOCIETY** - \$17 - H. Hansen (ONR) Shady Oaks Nursery (I) 2004 Plant: 18 in. (46 cm) diameter, 8 in. (20 cm) high; mound-like; slow. Leaf: 5 in. (13 cm) long, 4 in. (10 cm) wide; 11 pairs of veins; pure white; intensely blue green with green area where edge bleeds into the center margin; flat; glaucous bloom on top; glaucous bloom underneath; flat; broadly ovate; cordate base; Scape: 9 to 110 in. (23 cm) long; pinkish-white. Flower: 2 in. (5.58 cm) long; tubular; Waseca, MN - Aug 15 to Oct 1; Seed: sets pod; Clump History: original sport; 5 yrs old; Waseca, MN; Notable Characteristics: white centered 'June' sport Seasonal Variation: center gold-yellow in spring turns white [Sport of H. 'June'] VERY strong substance.

(Frozen Mert sdlg) New to the garden in 2010, I planted it too close to a killer peony. That peony has since been divided and hopefully will give Ibis more room to breathe. It still was a trooper though, it's pod fertile.:)



**IKTOMI** - Display Only - (Roberts-N., 1998) Height 32", bloom 5", season L, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, 5 buds, 3 branches, Spider Ratio 7.20:1, Wine red self with yellow throat. (Capulina Black Plush)

When this image was taken, the whole clump was actually out of the ground, hence weeping a bit. When in the ground, it's very elegant and graceful!

**NR LARGE R (BETTY'S PICK KID?)** - Display Only - Under further evaluation at this time for possible introduction. 9", 40", dormant, unusual coloring. Can poly, but rarely. Curlier and not as spatulate as Betty's Pick. Very fertile both ways.



**NR SMALL A** - Display Only - 6, MLa, orange infused with red, green and yellow throat. UF, fatter and redder than Small F and Small I.



**NR SMALL C** - Display Only - 6 red spider, extended yellow green throat.



**NR SMALL D** - Display Only - 5" spider, sorry, but didn't take accurate stats this year. Im hoping that the lack of color in this one might enable it to give up its color and take on others.



**NR SMALL E** - Display Only - It was only at the end of this summer that I realized that this is BR No. 10, a Ned seedling that was selected for introduction in 2008, but that didn't happen. EE, 4, 30 Ht, coral red, green throat, very curly segments. 3x rebloom!! 54 BC, 7-way branching. One of my personal favorites of the smalls, still in evaluation up north.



**NR SMALL F** - Display Only - 5-5.25", orange with yellow green throat, quilled petals and curly sepals. Very fertile. I suspect that NR Small F and NR Small I are the same plant, or at the very least, sibs.

**ORIENTAL EYES** - Display Only - (Menges, 1997) Height 24", bloom 3", season M, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, Fragrant, Lavender with light cream watermark and washed blue eyezone and dark purple band above a bright green throat. (Alpine Mist Jewel of Morning) Very good budcount, great scape. I'm hoping to bring the elusive "blues" into my small UF's.



**PARADIGM** - \$13 - Normal 0 MicrosoftInternetExplorer4 Walden West (OIR) C. Purtymun (N)1999 Plant: 20 in. (51 cm) diameter, 46 in. (117 cm) high; mound like; fast grower. This is a MUST for any hosta garden! Its color will change dramatically when fully leafed out.

(Mad Max Gadsden Goliath) Ive had Phyllis in my garden for a number of years now and each year she gets more and more beautiful. She needs a bit of breathing room at the moment, so I am willing to part with a fully-grown 4-fan piece of her. Outstanding bargain! Hint - to those hybridizers who think outside the box, she just might do great with doubles.:)

**PUPPET LADY** - \$20 - (Lambert-Whitacre, 1990) Height 30", bloom 8", season M, Dormant, Diploid, UFO Crispate , Deep burgundy red spider with wide cream throat. (RIGAMAROLE DIABOLIQUE)



**PURPLE MANY FACES** - Display Only - (Roberts-N., 1995) Height 28", bloom 9", season MLa, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, Fragrant, UF Crispate, Purple self with yellow throat.

'Krossa Regal'] Still in the process of leafing out in the early spring, this will indeed become very regal this year!

**ROSEMARY WHITACRE** - Display Only - (Roberts-N., 1999) Height 50", bloom 9.5", season M, Rebloom, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, Fragrant, 6 buds, 4 branches, UF Crispate, Light lavender with purple eyezone above green throat. (Rosy Lights Lavender Handlebars)



**ROYAL VINTAGE** - Display Only - (Warrell, 2010) Height 30", bloom 7", season MLa, Dormant, Diploid, 15 buds, 3 branches, UFO Crispate, Dark red with lavender watermark above yellow green throat. (sdlg Cold Cold Heart) One of the most used plants in the garden this year due to its watermark, which is unusual in a diploid UF. Both pod and pollen fertile. I'm super excited to have pods on some very special reds and a dark rose seedling!



**RUMEX SANGUINEUS** - Display Only - FABULOUS companion plant, commonly known as Bloody Root, Red Sorrel or Red Dock, perennial which if happy, can easily re-seed. I've heard that it likes water, but mine got no extra water. I've also heard that it likes shade, so I will be trying it in shade, but mine get quite a bit of sun. This pic was taken on Nov. 11, 2011 (how odd!) It had been repeatedly hit by frosts, you can see that the hem seedlings around it are going downhill, but every time it got hit by a frost, it popped right back up. And what color it provides! (Holly Dancer Wildest Dreams) Note from the hybridizer: "A bud builder with blooms from late June into September this year, with the unusual habit of blooming from proliferations along the scapes." A VERY long blooming plant and fertile both ways. Price is for a fully grown double fan, still \$100 on the hybridizer's website.



**SALUTE** - \$12 - Normal 0 MicrosoftInternetExplorer4 H. & D. Benedict (OR)1995 Plant: 10 in. (25 cm) diameter, 14 in. (36 cm) high; semi-upright; moderate growth. Slower breaking its dormancy than many others.



**SANTA'S PANTS** - Display Only - Sure is a cutie!



**SATCHMO** - \$15 - (Lambert-Savage, 1971) Height 30", bloom 8", season M, Dormant, Diploid, Very dark red overlaid black with green throat.. (WUTHERING HEIGHTS MYRTLE BURNETTE) NOTE: One of the darkest that I've grown, very cool!



**SCARLET BUTTERFLY** - Display Only - Another very small one from Bill Reinke, very well branched.



**SCARPIA** - Display Only - A shocker with its green throat. Despite Bob Schwarz' warning that it may be a southern plant, it was much stronger here than one of its parents, Tet Satan's Curls.



**SCISSORHANDS** - Display Only - Very unusual form, this image is different from Clayton's description, but it was a gorgeous bloom, I had to show it. Pod fertile.



**SEEDLING PASTEL SORBET** - Display Only - I don't think this seedling is anything special, but I accidentally used it with two poly crosses. Wouldn't you know it, they both took.:



**SHINY PENNY** - \$11 - Normal 0 MicrosoftInternetExplorer4 R. Solberg (ONIR)1997 12 in. (30 cm) diameter, 6 in. (15 cm) high; mound like; fast. This is one of those rare ground hugging varieties. Love the chartreuse center when emerging in the spring!



**SIR BLACKSTEM** - Display Only - (Hager, 1988) Height 24", bloom 2.5", season E, Rebloom, Evergreen, Diploid, Yellow brown and brown yellow reverse bicolor. {[PIZZA (sdlg RAINDROP)] GOLD THIMBLE} NOTE: VERY long bloomer! Great for the front of a bed.



**SIR BLACKSTEM** - Display Only - (Hager, 1988) Height 24", bloom 2.5", season E, Rebloom, Evergreen, Diploid, Yellow brown and brown yellow reverse bicolor. ((Pizza (sdlg Raindrop)) Gold Thimble) I've seen a couple of UF's registered out of SB, so I thought that a couple of crosses to bring down the size of the blooms might be worth a shot!



**SKINWALKER** - Display Only - (Roberts-N., 1997) Height 32", bloom 8.5", season M, Dormant, Diploid, Spider Ratio 5.20:1, Lavender blend with a green throat. STOUT MEDAL recipient, 2009. I have both the dip and tet versions, both very pollen fertile.



**SKY OVER SCHUYLER** - Display Only - What a hard to capture color on this one! This is an image of one scape. If it were to be shown in an AHS Show, it would have won Queen hands down. Blooms were always great, but on this scape, the placement of them were perfect. You can see that not one of them interferes with each other.



**SOMEPLACE SPECIAL** - Display Only - Sikes, 1990 Height 25", bloom 6", season M, Rebloom, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, Deep rose blend with big bright green throat. (Ronda Southern Charmer) Initially I had purchased this plant because I had seen it in bloom in two different gardens as a poly. I have since fallen in love with its hot pink color. (First pic on the collage is

off.)

(Catcher in the Eye sdlg) Just for fun, I've crossed this with tet spiders. Fertile both ways.



**SPIDERLING** - Sold Out - (Wheeler-M., 1981) Height 28", bloom 7.5", season E, Dormant, Diploid, (Medium red self with large greenish yellow throat.. (FERRIS WHEEL sdlg.)



**SPRITZER** - \$10 - P. Aden (R)1986 14 in. (36 cm) diameter, 18 in. (46 cm) high;



**STAINED GLASS** - \$15 - Normal 0 MicrosoftInternetExplorer4 H. Hansen (ON) H. Hansen & Shady Oaks Nursery (IR)1999 Plant: 32 in. (81 cm) diameter, 15 in. (38 cm) high; ; fast. This is a classic! This picture is very odd - it's usually is a graceful cascade. NOTE: This daylily usually peaks around the Fourth of July very appropriate, as it looks like fireworks going off in a clump!

**SUGAR PLUM JAM** - Display Only - There aren't enough supurlatives to describe this color.



**SWALLOW TAIL KITE** - Display Only - Strong grower, can't beat the colors. Sorry, not for sale.



**TALON** - Display Only - (Roberts-N., 1997) Height 25", bloom 6.5", season EM, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, UF Crispate, Purple self with a yellow throat. Stunning presentation, color and great growth habit, which is why I continue to use it as a breeder.



**TECHNY SPIDER** - Display Only - (Reckamp-Klehm, 1987) Height 21", bloom 7", season MLa, Dormant, Tetraploid, Fragrant, Yellow with pink cast and green throat. Always a favorite and the pic never does it justice. I've tried for years to turn it into a UF.:)



**TEENIE GIRL** - Display Only - (Reinke-B., 2004) Height 32", bloom 3", season MLa, Dormant, Diploid, Fragrant, 30 buds, 5 branches, Dark red with gold edge above deep green to gold throat. (sdlg Nutmeg Elf) ExTREMELY fertile!



**TENNESSEE RED** - Display Only - This is a big one, folks. I wonder what genetics it has to give to our future?



**TET WALT'S WINE** - Display Only - Used as a bridge plant early in my tet UF program, this one stayed around because of the great branching and easy fertility.

**TRI SIGMA LOVE** - Display Only - What a presence! This daylily is easily as distinctive as Trahlyta! (Roberts-N., 2003) Height 32", bloom 7", season MLa, Rebloom, Dormant, Diploid, Fragrant, 16 buds, 4 branches, UFo Cascade, Purple bitone with dark purple eye above yellow green throat. Betty informed me that this daylily is incorrectly spelled as Trisigma Love. It will be corrected in the AHS database. Not widely grown, it is a RARE plant!



**TURKEY TROT** - \$60 - (Warrell, 2004) Height 28", bloom 5.5", season M, Dormant, Diploid, 17 buds, 4 branches, UFo Crispate, Rose with rose red chevron and veining above green throat. (RINGS AND THINGS sdlg) A MUST for those breeding for small UF's, this fabulous plant had a budcount in the high 20s in my garden! Pod and pollen fertile. Price is for a fully grown double fan.



**WATERMELON MAN** - \$10 - (Whitacre-JA., 1990) Height 17", bloom 4.5", season M, Dormant, Diploid, Spider Ratio 5.00:1, Black red spider with chrome yellow throat. (CRIMSON PIRATE BEELZEBUB)



**WEB BROWSER** - Display Only - (Stamile, 1999) Height 32", bloom 12", season E, Rebloom, Semi-Evergreen, Tetraploid, Fragrant, 15 buds, 2 branches, Spider Ratio 5.60:1, Red self with chartreuse throat. (((Star of India Long Stocking) (Star of India Tet. Green Widow)) Long Tall Sally) Pollen fertile, have not been able to set a pod on it. This may be an oldie, but it's given me some of my keepers as a "spiderer," a plant that elongates petals.



**WEBSTER'S PINK WONDER** - Display Only - Truly dwarfs most other cultivars, very strong grower.

(4.31 cm) long; tubular; Westville, IN - Summer Period; Seed: sets viable seed; green seed pod; [H. 'Blue Arrow' H. nigrescens 'Elatior']
