**ALIEN STARDUST** - \$125 - (Reed, 2011) 50+MLa8-9dormant, diploid, SpiderOK, I have gone over to the dark side:a true spider!Alien Stardust has a 5:1 spider ratio, with all tepals rolling back.The form varies from open star to cascade.So it is a spider, an unusual form, and an extra large bloom (and tall).It has deep 3-way branching with about 24 buds.The basic color is light yellow, with stippling/dusting of rose and a green throat.Stunning light color in the late garden, the size grabs attention.Parentage is:(Kirsten Madeline Burkey x North Wind Dancer).Limited: only about six plants available now.



**AMETHYST TEARS** - \$80 - (Reed, 2010) 40 M 6dormant diploid. Ext.2 branches, 16 buds. Deep grape purple curling cascade.Green throat and light midribs. Very curling and ruffled,this is a Cascade uf but also measures as a true spider. Pod andpollen fertile.Sunfast,delicate scapes. (Planet Maxx Brer Rabbits Baby).

**ANNABELLE'S GHOST** - \$17 - Reinke, '95 - 34" M 8" dor.dip.Spider. Clear lavender spider with cream apricot throat

**APACHE WAR DANCE** - Sold Out - Thomas, Dale, 1994 30" MLre 4.5" Dor Tet Frag, Noc. Ext. Scarlet Red, darker eye, great hot late color. Destined to be a classic. Excellent parent for late tets. Not many late tets are this good.



**APPLEBERRY MOUNTAIN** - \$45 - (Reed, 09) 36" M 6" semievergreen diploid, ext. sunfast Intense bright raspberry red with ruffles and a yellow throat narrowing down to green. It has some branching and a good bud count. It is easily fertile both ways. Bright color and open, graceful form make it show-off. The pollen parent was NATHAN SOMMERS, which gives us some beautiful red colors, and the pod parent was a dormant, hardy seedling out of Lola Branham and some red and pink seedlings ("Red Lola" x "Hot Pink").

**ASIATIC PHEASANT** - \$8 - Knowler, '73 - 22" M 6" dor.dip. UF Crinkly edge, gold yellow with lighter edge, late

**AUTUMN MINARET** - \$8 - Stout, '51 - 66" Mla-Vla 4" dor.dip. Extremely tall, very well branched, high performance, orange/yellow

**BALI WATERCOLOR** - \$15 - (Stamile, 2002) Evergreen Tet. 35" MRe 9" fragrant spider. Lavender with silvery watermark. A top parent of tet spider.

**BARBARA** - \$8 - Sheets, '65 - 38" V1a 5" dor.dip.frag. Spidery, creamy yellow blooms 6-9 weeks until frost.

**BARCODE** - \$55 - (Stamile, 2007) 33" ERe 5" evergreen tet. Cream yellow with multi-colored eye. Excellent parent for patterns.

**BEYOND THE RIM** - \$15 - (Baxter, 2002) 20" E 11", , Evergreen, Diploid, Spider Ratio 6.00:1, Curling twirling purple red with deeper eye and large brilliant green throat.

**BIRDWING BUTTERFLY** - \$20 - Burkey, '00 - 45" M1a 7" dor.dip. UF Yellow/lavender with purple band, extremely good branching, tall

**BLAST FROM THE PAST** - \$20 - Clement '06 - 55" VL 5" sev. Dip, Very Late, Very Tall dark yellow with lighter edge, hardy. I can't say enough about this plant. It is one of the longest blooming plants in the garden. It starts late and blooms until around frost. It stands out from across the garden. It has somewhat old fashioned blooms, that are completely sunfast. A good candidate for a perennial border, or a non irrigated area. Congratulations to Bret on this plant.



**BLOWING BUBBLES** - \$100 - (Murphy, 2010) 42 MRe 7.5dormant diploid ext.fr. 3 branches, 31 buds. Lavender with a bluish watermark, cream midrib and edge; Diamond dusted.Unusual form pinched crispate.Very sunfast, fertile,and an excellent parent.Won best seedling in the region 3 Hybridizers bed 2009. Excellent garden plant and excellent on the show bench. (Seedling x Far Galaxies)

**BLUEBERRY BREAKFAST** - \$12 - (Rose, 1988) 22" M 5" dormant diploid. Narrow slate-lavender with purple midribs and deep purple eye. Fantastic parent for unusual colors.

**BO KNOWS** - \$10 - Bennett, F., '01 - 22" M 4" dor.dip. Light rose with eye and edge, green throat, from Dragon's Eye.

**BRER RABBIT'S BABY** - \$15 - Roberts, Ned '02 - 30" M 5" sev.dip.frag. Uf Black red self, curly

**CABERNET CABARET** - \$45 - Reed, 2007 - 48" M 7" dor. Dip. Elegant dark black red, well branched Tall, dark, and well-branched, this cultivar out of Chief Black Hand and Planet Max carries on their grand tradition. The blooms are large and dark wine-red toward black. The scapes are erect and nicely branched, with a good bud count. It won best seedling in the NCDC show in 2006 (Washington DC area). The blooms are elegant and narrow, with gentle ruffling. Yellow to green throat, sunproof, fertile.

**CATCH THE SPIRIT** - \$8 - Santa Lucia 2000 38" Mre 7" Dor Dip UF Rusty Rose Blend dark rose edge. Blooms forever, with bud building and rebloom. Vic selected this one for performance!



**CHERRY PEACOCK** - \$75 - 45" M 7.25" dormant diploid. Rose pink with a darker rose-red band, green throat. This has tall, deeply-branched scapes with 3 way branching and 26 buds. Nice presentation of the blooms. Pollen fertile, pods difficult but possible. A garden favorite for years!

**CHIEF BLACK HAND** - Display Only - Warrell '98 - 36" M la 6.5" dor. dip. ext. uf Black Red self

**CHIEF FOUR FINGERS** - \$18 - Roberts, N. 2002 44" M 6" SEV Dip EXT Polymerous Dark red purple with black eye. Excellent parent for polys.



**CHIPMUNK** - \$25 - (Reed, 2010) 40 M 4 dormant diploid Cute as a chipmunk, this little brown spidery bloom has a black stripe (eye) and green throat. It is tall, well-branched, and has lots of bloom. Not quite a miniature or a true spider, it has potential in that direction. It is out of REUTHERS BROWN SPIDER x BROWN WITCH, which gives it a heritage of vigor and pod fertility.

**CITRINA VESPERTINA** - \$10 - species - 60" M 3" dor. noc. Yellow trumpet self, very fragrant



**COLD HEARTED** - \$15 - Reed, 2008 - 26" M 5" dor. Dip. Cool lavender with big pale white frosty throat. This cool lavender bloom has a white center, with frost permeating the middle of the bloom. Under its garden name, White Faced seedling, it was noticed by many visitors because of its large white area. It is not narrow, but flat-faced, presenting the color pattern nicely. Green deep in the throat. Fertile.

**COMFORT AND JOY** - \$35 - (Reinke-J., 2004) 30" M 7", Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, Fragrant, 15 buds, 3 branches, Lavender pink bitone with rosy lavender halo above green to creamy throat. ((Indian Giver sdlg Tomorrow's Song)



**COMPASS ROSE** - \$30 - (Reed, 2010) 40 La 5 dormant diploid. 4 branches, 24 buds. You can't get lost going in this direction. A late bloomer, Compass Rose starts 4-5 weeks after midseason, like its parent, After Awhile Crocodile. Light rose with a darker rose band, yellow-cream throat. Striking in the late season. (After Awhile Crocodile x seedling)



**CRABTREE FALLS** - \$60 - (Reed, 2011) 38 M 8 dormant, diploid, Spider New Tall Cherry was the garden name of this one, and cherry-rose describes the color. Almost rose-red in the morning, fading to pretty rose pink after a very hot day; still blooming at the end of July, it has a long season of bloom. It measures as a true spider (4.8:1), but it is also a graceful, tailored, smooth cascade. It has a cream-gold to green throat and cream midribs. 2-way branching, 15-16 buds. It is named after a waterfall in the Blue Ridge.

Parentage unknown.

**DANCING WITH SANDRA** - \$25 - Thomas, Dale, '05 32" VL 4.75" Dormant Tetraploid Fragrant Russet orange red with brighter eye. VERY SHOWY. Yellow green throat. FIVE BRANCHES 23 buds.

**DAZZLE THEM** - \$10 - Bennett, F., '98 - 21" EM 3.5" sev.dip. Round rose/red little one

**DELICATE ONE** - Sold Out - Reinke, 2006 38" ML 7" Dev Dip Frag 20% Polytepal Yellow with halo, green throat. Near spider. Margo and I have both been very impressed with this plant. Easy, long blooming and consistent.



**DON'T PANIC** - \$65 - 36"MLa6.5"dormant diploid.Bright rose pink with cream to white midribs and edges on petals and sepals, giving a striped effect. The throat is gold with olive deep in the throat.3 branches, 20 buds. From a cross of (Fossil Record x Foxy Loxy).Stands out in the garden! Fertile both ways.

**DOUBLE BETTY HARDIN** - \$15 - (Kropf, 1999)26" EM5.5", Dormant, Diploid, 16 buds, 3 branches, Double 100%, Rose lavender self with yellow to green throat. Excellent layered double.

**DREAM CATCHER** - \$18 - Roberts, Ned '95 - 36" Mla 10" dor.dip. Spider Rose bronze blend very large

**DROOPY DRAWERS** - \$20 - (Murphy, 2005) 54" LRe 8" dormant diploid, fragrant UF cascade. Red with gold midribs that curls, twirls, and hangs down. Tough as nails.

**EARLIANNA** - \$8 - Betscher '38 - 24" Ere dor.dip.frag.ext. Very early cute yellow orange trumpets.



**EARTH JEWELS** - \$100 - 38"M 8"dormant diploid.Light rose pink With a "lipstick" rose-red band and lime green throat. There is a barely-discernible watermark on the sepals, which may be important for pattern breeding.Out of (Crystalline Entity x Nathan Sommers). Fertile both ways.

**ENIGMA VARIATIONS** - \$35 - (Clement, 2004) 34" MLa 8" dormant diploid. UF crispate. Purple with white watermark and midribs. Excellent and not well-distributed.

**ENTWINED IN THE VINE** - \$80 - (Emmerich, 2007) 32" MRe 8" evergreen tet. very fragrant. Lavender Pink with multi-patterned lavender violet eye and edges. We really like this plant, it is hardy and grows well here.

**FANCIFUL FINERY** - \$8 - Kirchoff, '84 - 15" EERe ev.dip.frag. Amber blend double with pink highlights, blooms 3 times here.

**FIRE FROM HEAVEN** - \$8 - Grovenstein, '85 - 28" M 5.5" dor.tet. Bright, sunfast, narrow red tet. Good parent, great plant. When it is 100 degrees, this plant is the brightest red in the garden until sunset. At dawn, this plant is the brightest red in the garden. Because it is old does not mean that it shouldn't be in every garden for this reason.

**FIRESTORM** - \$8 - Krekler, '79 - 31' EM 8.25" dor.dip. UF Brick red with gold throat, good parent

**FLAMBOYANT PROMISE** - Sold Out - Thomas, '99 - 32" La 6" sev.tet. UF distinctive orange rose, late blooming

**FLAMBOYANT VAMP** - \$8 - Lunsford, '93 - 24" E 12" dor.dip. Rose pink self with cream throat.

**FLEUR DE ROCAILLE** - \$8 - Whitacre, '88 - 30" M 4" dor.dip. Spider. Blueish pink and yellow bitone, red and cream eye.



**FLIGHT OF ORCHIDS** - \$45 - Reed, 2005 - 40" M 6" dor.dip. UF Lavender with purple eye, green throat One of my favorites! This unusual form (crispate) features both the rolled sepals and the patterned, dark purple feathered eye on ruffled petals. This is the best of a number of seedlings out of a Jack Carpenter seedling. The blooms have good substance, and the plants make large fans. Fertile both ways. A scape of this cultivar won best unusual form in the Richmond (RADS) flower show in 2005, until it was disqualified for being registered the same year.



**FOCUS** - \$65 - (Murphy, 2010) 39MLa7dormant diploid ext.fr.3 branches, 23 buds. Black purple with a black band, chartreuse throat, and ruffled edges;diamond dusted.Unusually sunfast for a dark color and a seaof blooms in the late season. Fertile. (Dont Know Jack x Chief Black Hand) The only cultivar with this parentage, and an excellent parent. Hard Dormant

**FOL DE ROL** - \$8 - Connell, '54 - 40" Mla 7" ev.dip. Spider Brown-yellow blend, chevron eye, classic antique, still good

**FOREST LAKE RAGAMUFFIN** - \$15 - Harding, '93 - 28 EMRe 5.5" dor.tet Pink with gorgeous gold ruffle, excellent parent

**FOX EARS** - \$10 - Roberts, N. 2002 40" ML 8" SEV Dip Frag. Ext. UF Very different purple bitone, that blooms for a long time. Unusual Unusual Form.



**FREE RADICAL** - \$30 - Reed, 2007 - 28" M 6" dor. Dip. UF Crispate. Palest lavender to near white, with a green throat. Radical form with quilled sepals.

**FREEWHEELING** - \$25 - Stamile, P. 2004 34" EERE 9" EV Tet Spider Huge Cream Yellow Burgundy Red Eye, Choice. This cultivar appears to be completely hardy here, showing no winter damage. Truly excellent parent, difficult pods.

**GREEN INFERNO** - Sold Out - Gossard 06 39" EMRE 7.5" Dormant diploid 5/1 spider. Neon green above green throat. Excellent parent for green and red spiders with green throats.

**HANDWRITING ON THE WALL** - \$40 - Emmerich '07 24" MRE 6" SEV Tetraploid Fragrant Dusty pink with lavender eye and edge, doubled with gold. Yellow green throat, 4 way branching. Excellent.

**H. CITRINA** - \$10 - God or Darwin! 50" M 4" Dor Dip near spider. Cute yellow trumpets, strongly nocturnal, blooms 2 months, very very fragrant. Very hard dormant, going down in September here, and coming up in April.

**MALAYSIAN MONARCH** - \$8 - Munson, '86 - 24" EMRe 6" semi.tet. Award winning Burgundy Purple self with chalky eye

**MARILYN GRUA** - \$35 - (Bachman, 2004) 48" EM 7.75" semi-evergreen diploid. UF cascade. Purple self. Excellent here.

**MEDICINE FEATHER** - \$20 - Roberts, '01 - 48" EMRe 9" semi.dip.frag.ext. Spider Light garnet with darker eye, long bloom season

**MONKEY SEE MONKEY DO** - \$20 - Dickerson, '02 - 18" E 3" dor.tet. Pink with cherry eye, green throat great rebloomer

**MORK THE STORK** - \$50 - (Clement,2007)40" EM8", Dormant, Diploid, 14 buds, 3 branches, UFo Spatulate , Yellow self above green throat. (Limited Edition Desert Icicle) Very tall, huge and imposing.

**MYSTIC JELLYFISH** - Sold Out - Gossard 06 35" MRE 10.5" Dormant Diploid Spider. Rusty Orange with darker maroon eye above a yellow orange throat. Extremely Showy. 4 branches, 16 buds.

**NATHAN SOMMERS** - \$25 - Roberts, '01 - 32" Mre 8.5" semi.dip.ext. UF Striking raspberry red, ruffled, excellent parent

**NEVER SAY NEVER** - \$20 - Hanson, C., '00 - 33" M 7" dor.dip. UF Orchid self, very blue-ish.

**NICOLE JORDAN** - \$10 - Branham '92 - 35" L 5.5" Dor. Tet Showy orange red self with gold throat, very fertile.



**ODDS BODKINS** - \$15 - Reed, 2008 - 38" EM 7" dor. Dip. UF crispate Dark red with black eyezone, pinched Another out of Chief Black Hand (and Mad Max), I consider this uf an improved Rocky Horror. With some of the same form and color, it is larger, and has a stronger scape with better branching. The blooms are large, have heavy substance, and are sunproof. Very dark, the red-purple has a darker, almost black eye. The petals are long and pinched, sometimes twirling. The edges get lighter on a hot day, but the bloom continues to look good. Fertile. Green throat.

**OLALLIE KEITH** - \$10 - Darrow, '81 - 27" Mla 4.5" dor. Dip. Burgundy and cream bicolor, yellow-green throat good late

**OLD DEVIL MOON** - Sold Out - Bennett, F., '01 - 28" M 7" dor.dip. Big, wide, cream pink blend, green throat, lots of buds.



**ONE LAST PIE** - \$40 - Murphy, E. '07 - 45" Vlr 6.5" Dor dip Striking rose with gold and green throat, cream midribs. Fertile. This always impresses people in the very late garden, with it's consistent performance in August, September, and even October.

**ORCHID LADYSLIPPER** - Sold Out - Branham '79 - 36 EM 5.5" Dor dip Orchid with cream edges, yellow green throat, Lambert breeding.



**PALE ALE** - \$110 - (Murphy, 2010) 44MLa7dormant diploid ext.fr.3 branches, 24 buds. Light pink and stippled cream with a light green throat and ruffled edge. Unusual form cascade, that blooms for many weeks into the very late season. 100% sunfast; fertile. (Margo Reed Indeedx Heavenly Curls)

**PANCAKE PLATYPUS** - \$20 - Baxter '02 - 24" Ere 6.25" Ev dip Polytepal Yellow with raised midribs. High % polytepal, fertile.

**PANIC IN DETROIT** - Sold Out - Adams, Rick '02 - 40" Mla 8" dor.tet.frag. Reddish orange with white midribs, showstopper in our garden, with a long bloom season.

**PASSING FANCY** - \$10 - Bennett, F., '00 - 25" Mre 6" dor.dip. Rose, with red band, yellow green throat, performance plus. Pretty.



**PIEDMONT PALEFACE** - \$25 - (Murphy, '06) - 56" La 5" semi-evergreen diploid. UF cascade, lavender purple with large pale lemon-cream face. Quite tall. This is a most unusual color. Starts blooming late, after many have finished blooming. It is a dark reddish lavender first thing in the morning, with a striking lemon cream midrib. As the day progresses, the lavender gets much lighter and clearer, and the throat opens and fades to a striking lemon cream-white, getting larger as the day progresses. It has one completely hardy parent, and it showed no damage during our -10F open winter when it was a baby. 3 way branching, 18 buds.

Fertile both ways. Parentage: After Awhile Crocodile X unknown

**PILGRIM PARK** - \$35 - (Tankesley-Clarke, 2005) 24" MLa4.5", Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, 10 buds, 3 branches, Double 99%, Rose self above yellow green throat. ((Vanilla Fluff Calico Print) Savage) Very hardy, fast grower.

**POINT OF VIEW** - \$10 - Roberts, S. '92 - 35" EMRe 7.5" dor.tet.ext. Deep Signal Red self, very showy on strong scapes

**POLTERGEIST** - \$15 - Couturier, G. '98 - 38" Mre 7.5" sev.dip. Fragrant UF Pale cream pink, golden eye, fades to white

**POLY B'GOLLY** - \$50 - (Wetzel, 2008) 22" EE3.25", Rebloom, Dormant, Diploid, 10 buds, 2 branches, Polymerous 80%, Soft yellow self above yellow to light green throat. (Quad Quiddity Quint Quandary) Very small cute high-percentage poly. Fertile. Makes tiny fans.

**PUMPKIN TIME** - \$15 - (Sobek, 1984) 37" La 5.25", Dormant, Diploid, Gold orange self. (Cartwheels Burning Daylight) This is the champion bud-builder of all time, right up there with BARBARA. In bloom from midseason to frost.

**QUAD QUIDDITY** - \$20 - Wetzel, '05 - 24" EMRe 4" Lemon yellow self, 75% polytepal blooms

**RADIANT MOONBEAM** - \$10 - Larch, '78 - 36" Mla 6.5" semi.dip. Classic near white self, excellent parent for spidery whites.



**RESONATE** - Sold Out - (Murphy, 2010) 40E8 semi-evergreen tetraploid, ext. 2 branches, 15 buds. Extra large reddish lavender with purple veins, chartreuse throat and yellow midribs with a narrow cream edge, diamond dusted. On cool mornings this flower starts purple. Sunfast, fertile. Tet (Cameroon Night x Waiting in the Wings)

**ROYAL JESTER** - \$10 - Kennedy +, '91 - 24" Late 6" dor. dip. frag. Strawberry/cream bicolor, very ruffled, very late, good branching

**RUBY SPIDER** - \$10 - Stamile, '91 - 34" E 9" dor. tet. Huge red show-stopper, yellow throat. UF- spatulate. - HM, AM,

**RUFFLED VINTAGE BURGUNDY** - Sold Out - Krupien, '92 - 30" M 3.5" dor. dip. High-performing dark burgundy purple, darker eye, cute small.
